**Purpose and Mission:** The Maryland Abuse Intervention Collaborative's (MAIC) goal is to ensure that there are quality and effective abuse intervention programs throughout Maryland. Our mission is to improve victim safety, hold abusers accountable and eliminate intimate partner violence and abuse.

**Who We Are:** MAIC is a statewide network of experienced professionals committed to eradicating intimate partner violence. Current participation includes representation from the Governor's Office of Crime Control & Prevention (GOCCP), the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence (MNADV), Division of Parole and Probation (DPP), Department of Social Services (DSS), substance abuse programs, certified abuse intervention programs and abuse intervention programs seeking certification.

**Scope of Work:** The Collaborative discusses coordinated community responses, promotes evidence-based best practices, conducts research, offers peer support and advocates for quality abuse intervention programs by educating, providing technical assistance to and collaborating with service providers and criminal justice professionals.
